Grand Lodge Guidelines

The exemplification of the EA and FC degrees is now be permitted beginning July 1st, yet the decision to do so is up to the master of the lodge. If the lodge decides to conduct an EA or FC degree, the following will be adhered to:

- Before the degree begins, the candidate's three questions and collection of the degree fee by the secretary and changing into the candidate's garb, will be done prior to starting the degree to minimize the time in a small preparation room.
- Once the work begins in the lodge room, the decision on how to proceed is left to the master and his officers.
- To do this safely, the candidate will be prepared in the room adjoining the lodge with only one steward if the room does not permit distancing for the usual three brethren.
- The candidate will wear a face covering
- The senior deacon is not required to wear a face covering when receiving the candidate nor while interacting in the South, West and East.
- The SD and candidate will keep 6' from the officers participating in the interaction of the degree
- The only contact with the candidate will be with the master or the senior deacon.
- The hoodwink shall be lined with a protective liner.
- The chaplain will stand at a distance for the candidate's prayer and remain in the east for the charge during circumambulation and the closing charge as well.
- Have hand sanitizer be available at the JW's station and elsewhere in the lodge hall for use after the grip is given. Consensus is that a bare hand is better than a gloved hand.
- Once the candidate removes his garb, the clothing will be put into a plastic bag and laundered before use with the next candidate. The lodge may recommend that the candidate bring his own sweatpants and shirt that he can launder on his own.
- Multiple candidates are going to be more difficult and the lodge will have to be more creative to maintain distancing requirements.

Upon completion of the degree for the evening please leave the lodge hall promptly after sanitizing the touched surfaces.

These are only a few guidelines which must be adhered to. I am confident that the lodges will find the best way to exemplify the degrees and remain safe.

If there are any questions or concerns please contact me or the grand secretary and we will do what we can to assist you.

I will keep you posted regarding the resumption of the MM degree.

Greetings Brethren,

Be it known that as of 08/01/2020 the Masonic lodges in Maine's grand jurisdiction may resume meal service. The following guidelines must be adhered to:

- In a buffet style meal, the service line will only be attended by the servers. No brethren other than the servers, with gloves and face coverings, will handle food.
- The servers will be the only ones to handle the plates.
- The brethren being served must wear face coverings while navigating the buffet line and do your best to maintain social distance.
- Coffee will be served only by the servers.
- Face coverings are replaced once your meal is done.
- Disposable plates, utensils, cups, etc. are recommended
- Individual packets of condiments as well as salt and pepper, coffee creamers and pats of butter should be used and not placed on the tables.
- Unused condiments should not be returned to the kitchen for reuse. Bring them home or discard of them.
- Coffee and donuts? Servers only will handle this also. Masked and gloved.
- Seating for the meal must maintain 6' social distancing.
- BBQ meals outside should be conducted in the same manner.
- At completion of the meals the kitchen, dining room must be sanitized.

I am certain that each of the lodges will conduct themselves with the health and welfare of their brethren in mind. With that, I leave you to implement any added safety measures that you see fit. Be well, be safe, have fun!
